INTRODUCTION

The Mental Health Scholarships: Undergraduate (MHS: UG PSY) is funded by the Australian Government, Department of Health and Aged Care (DoHAC) and administered by Australian College of Nursing (ACN).

You are required to read and understand these terms and conditions in their entirety before you accept the scholarship. You are required to accept the terms and conditions for each new academic year of the scholarship. These terms and conditions are subject to change.

RECEIVING A SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility

To be eligible for a scholarship applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Are an Australian citizens or permanent resident
- Are enrolled or intending to enrol in undergraduate psychology studies in 2022
- Are planning to progress to full registration as a psychologist working in a mental health setting.

Funding

The maximum amount of funding is from \$15,000 to \$30,000 per scholarship

GENERAL INFORMATION

Effect of other scholarships

You may only accept and at any one time, hold one government funded scholarship administered by ACN.

Assessment of course

ACN will use all resources available to determine the eligibility of your nominated course outlined in your original application. However, upon receipt of your enrolment evidence it may become apparent that your course does not meet the eligibility criteria of this scheme or is in fact more than one course. In this instance, ACN will contact you to discuss and your scholarship may be withdrawn.

Courses must be provided by a university or registered training organisation within Australia

PAYMENT ARRANGEMENTS

Scholarship payments

Scholarships are considered a contribution toward the cost of accessing your awarded course. It is expected that the scholar will meet some of the costs of the course themselves.

Scholarship payments will not commence until all required acceptance documentation has been received by ACN. Required documents must be received by ACN two weeks prior to a scheduled payment date in order for a payment to be activated.

The first semester scholarship payments will be activated at the start of the academic year upon receipt of enrolment confirmation. The second semester payments will be activated upon receipt of results for the first half of the academic year and enrolment confirmation for the second half of the academic year.

Scholarship funds will not be paid if you have deferred your course.

You will not be required to provide documentary evidence of how you utilise scholarship funds. You will, however, be required to provide evidence of continued enrolment and academic progression to ensure ongoing payment of the scholarship.

Payment reconciliation Repayment of funds

If you cease to fulfil the terms of your scholarship and fail to inform ACN, you will be required to repay funds received from the time you ceased to be eligible. Ceasing to fulfil the terms of the scholarship may include:

- · withdrawal from course
- · change of course
- ceasing to be an Australian citizen or permanent resident
- acceptance of another scholarship administered by ACN
- failing to provide satisfactory evidence of study undertaken whilst receiving scholarship payments

ACADEMIC STATUS

Results and re-enrolment

Upon completion of each semester scholarship recipients are required to provide ACN with official documentary evidence of results and re-enrolment for the funded course. Failure to provide these documents will result in your scholarship being withdrawn.

Changes in mode of study

You may change from full time to part time study (or vice versa) during your course. However, your final awarded amount for the course will not increase.

SCHOLARSHIP STATUS

Commonwealth supported places

Scholarship payments will not be affected if you receive a commonwealth supported place.

Commencement of scholarship

You must commence your study within the calendar year for which the scholarship place is awarded. If you do not commence study within the calendar year your scholarship will be withdrawn.

Change of circumstances

You are required to provide ACN with written advice of any substantial change to your circumstances, contact details or other relevant eligibility criteria within 14 days of the changes taking place.

Ongoing awarding of scholarship

In order to remain eligible for the scholarship, you must:

- continue to be an Australian citizen or Australian permanent resident
- be continuously enrolled in an eligible course
- provide satisfactory results and re-enrolment at the completion of each semester

Deferral of scholarship place

You may request a deferral of your scholarship. A deferral may be granted if:

- you have commenced your course of study and have received at least one semester of scholarship payments
- total period of deferral is no more than 12 months
- deferral is for one or two semesters (not for part-semesters, weeks or months).

Students are not required to justify their need to defer or give detailed reasons.

Completing the scholarship

Once you have completed your course you are required to provide the following:

evidence of completion of the funded course (either final results or a completion certificate).

Determining study load

ACN determines scholarship payments based a scholar's study load during each semester. This is based on what the course provider classifies as full time or part time enrolment. ACN does not consider the following as weighting in your study load:

- travel time to and from course provider or relevant activities
- employment/ work hours.
- Subjects for which you have been given RPL or CT.

If you are studying an online course in a self-paced structure, ACN determines your study load to be part time. If at the end of the semester, a full-time study load has been completed with confirmation from your course provider, you may be entitled to receive a back payment of full-time payments for that semester.

If you do not maintain a satisfactory rate of progress, you may have to repay scholarships funds or complete your course without any further scholarship payments.

Recognised prior learning (RPL)

ACN is only able to provide funding to scholarship recipients for subjects they actively study each semester. If you receive RPL, subjects included in RPL do not count towards your study load.

Changes in semester enrolment

If you change your study load at any time throughout a semester or course of study, you must notify ACN within 14 days of this change. Once notified, ACN will determine if your scholarship payments need to be altered to reflect this change. This includes for

- withdrawing from a unit/s of study
- enrolling in an additional unit/s of study
- withdrawing from units before your course provider census date
- being awarded RPL.

Withdrawal from course

If you withdraw from your course, you must relinquish your scholarship. You must provide ACN with evidence from your course provider confirming the withdrawal. This must be provided to ACN within 14 days of withdrawing. If you fail to provide this to ACN within 14 days, you may be required to repay funds received. You are eligible to apply for a new scholarship place in a future year.

Withdrawal of scholarship

Your scholarship may be withdrawn at any stage if you:

- provide incorrect information or withhold relevant information
- fail to comply with these terms and conditions
- you fail in the reasonable opinion of ACN to achieve satisfactory academic progress
- fail to provide results and re-enrolment in a timely manner each semester.

Appeals

You may not appeal the selection of scholarship recipients or the amount of funding awarded. The decision is considered final and no further correspondence will be entered into.

COURSE/ACTIVITIES

Change of course

Funding under this scholarship is awarded for the specific course as outlined in your email of offer. Requests to change the course or educational institution for which you are awarded funding must be submitted to ACN in writing along with supporting documentation within 14 days. ACN will notify you of the outcome of your request. A change in course may result in a change in value (increase or decrease) from your original scholarship offer.

Requests to change course are not automatically approved.

A scholarship place must be surrendered if you discontinue a course of study or enroll in a different course without prior approval.

CENTRELINK AND TAXATION

Centrelink

For the purposes of Centrelink assessment, ACN can provide a letter of scholarship details and payments to scholars. All requests for such documentation must be received in writing from the scholar only.

Income tax advice

ACN is unable to offer tax or financial advice. For assistance with determining the taxation status of scholarships in your personal circumstances, you are strongly encouraged to seek advice from the Australian Tax Office (www.ato.gov.au), a registered Tax Agent, or Centrelink (www.centrelink.gov.au) if appropriate.

It is a requirement that all scholarship recipients complete the Statement by a Supplier form. PAYG payment summaries (group certificates) will not be issued at the end of the financial year.

STUDY ABROAD

If you undertake an elective overseas placement as part of your course of study, you will continue to receive scholarship funds as if you were studying in Australia. You will not receive any additional ACNS funds. Continued receipt of scholarship funds is subject to you demonstrating that the overseas placement is:

- a component of your Australian university course
- withdrawing from a unit/s of study
- enrolling in an additional unit/s of study
- withdrawing from units before your course provider census date
- being awarded RPL.

PRIVACY STATEMENT

The Australian Privacy Principles contained in the Privacy Act 1998 (CTH) and the Privacy Amendment (Enhancing Privacy Protection) Act 2012, except when qualified by any relevant Codes of Practice, will underpin all matters related to personal information collected and held by ACN. The ACN Privacy Policy can be found on the ACN website.

Complaints about acts or practices of the Fund Administrator may be investigated by the Privacy Commissioner who has power to award compensation against the Fund Administrator in appropriate circumstances.

You agree to participate in any surveys that may be conducted by ACN or a third party acting on behalf of the Department of Health and Aged Care to collect information relevant to your scholarship.

RESERVATIONS

ACN reserves the right to suspend, amend or vary the guidelines, terms and conditions, the scholarship or any part thereof. The Australian Government reserves to itself in its absolute discretion the right to terminate or cancel any scholarship under the program.

Unless otherwise specifically agreed in writing, nothing in these conditions shall bind the Australian Government or ACN to any conditions, commitments or obligations, of any type.
